What:	<p><b>Alberta Supports connects clients to appropriate resources available throughout the province. Not all resources are available in Drayton Valley.</b></p> <p><b>Alberta Works offers employment services, training, health benefits and income support.</b></p> <p><b>Alberta Works administers the AISH (Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped) program to provide financial and health-related assistance to eligible adults with a disability. The disability must be permanent and substantially limit the person's ability to earn a living. AISH clients may also be eligible to receive supplemental assistance (child and personal benefits).</b></p>
